#### CORE CITY CLASSIFICATIONS

|                             |   |
|-----------------------------|---|
| Pre-War Core & Non-Suburban | no change in boundaries since 1940.   |
| Pre-War & Suburban          | Has pre-war core, however contains substantial post-war suburban development (generally due to large annexations) |
| Post War Suburban           | Has smaller pre-war core. Less than 100,000 population in 1940 and nearly all development is post-war             |

#### CORE CITIES

Core city is historic core city (core city in 1950)

First city named only, plus Oakland (in San Francisco-Oakland) and St. Paul (in Minneapolis-St. Paul)
